

Banned Drinker Register

Secondary Supply

- Secondary supply is the act of providing alcohol to a person that is on the Banned Drinker Register (BDR).
- Secondary supply is an offence and will result in a BDR ban for the offender and a fine of up to 20 penalty points (\$3080).

What is secondary supply?

Secondary supply is the act of intentionally supplying alcohol to a banned person that you ought reasonably to have known is on the BDR.

What is the punishment for secondary supply?

If found to be supplying alcohol to a banned person, you will go on the BDR and be charged with the offence of secondary supply.

The penalty for being found guilty of secondary supply is up to 20 penalty units (\$3080).

How can someone appeal?

An appeal can be made to the Northern Territory Civil Administrative Tribunal (NTCAT).
